



The LightFour's little brother

A 1934 Evinrude Lightwin Imperial

This motor is the basic model of 1934 Evinrude Lightwin Imperial (model 4030 with rope start). Various versions were made from 1934-1936. Only the 1934 models had no OMC emblem on the front of the hood. The first alternate firing twin from Evinrude; the Lightwin Imperials seem to be very hard to find. The motor pictured has a homemade exhaust pipe with cutout. The 1934 models were rated 5.5 HP, weight 47 pounds, rubber mounted, with 2" aluminum pistons, iron cylinders, & bronze rods. The correct standard prop, which is on this model 4030 is stamped on the hub 75B (the Heavy Duty prop was stamped 73C). The '35-'36 models were rated 5.1 HP. All 3 years have differences in major powerhead parts plus various '34-'36 models had these features: full reverse steering, Rope Start, "Ratchet Spring Starter", "Simplex Starter", Propeller Protection Clutch, 5" & 15" long shafts, Elto brand, Evinrude brand, battery ignition, magneto ignition.
