





I'm hoping to have Ernie at the December Meet in Newport. Ernie would be an asset to OUR CLUB.







Or you may be interested in a sport that is gaining in popularity day by day—outboard cruising. You will be seeing things from a new angle as you cruise strange new waters, finding exclusive and seclutled beaches lor picnics and swimming. You may want to take an overnight trip on your boat, or a trip that lasts several days, either camping out at night or sleeping on the boat itself.

All or any part of this is possible if you own your own boat. In comparison with other boats, the outboard motor boat and motor are inexpensive to buy, can be readily hauled about, do not cost too much to repair, and can usually be stored in your own garage. If you cannot afford a new boat and motor, good used ones are available that will enable you to enjoy many of the vachtsman's pleasures without the expense that goes with owning a yacht.

However, a great deal of your pleasure depends on selecting the right combination of boat and motor for the particular sport in which you are interested. Before you become an old hand at running your outboard motorboat you will also want to have basic knowledge of its operation and the traffic requirements of our water wonderways.
