

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# Member Activity: Paul Brinkman's New Taxi!





I removed the cylinders as well as the expansion plugs. After poking around the water jackets to remove the buildup of rust the motor did not overheat again. I was quite happy. I moved on to my next project; replacing a cracked cylinder on a Johnson A-25.

A hiatus of many years followed during which time I finished college and spent 20 years as a US Naval Officer. Due to the frequent changes in duty stations I could not reasonably pursue my interest in outboard motors. It would have been a challenge to work on an outboard in the Mekong Delta, Ethiopian highlands or a small 2 man room onboard a ship.

# **Answer to the Mystery Motor Quiz**





The Factory Building on the Moscow (Moskva) River in modern times. Completely re-purposed as a chocolate factory and tourist destination. That's the Monument to Peter the Great in the background.

The Russian Mockba aka Moskva aka MOSCOW; Copy of a Scott Atwater 10 It was 1956 and the USSR could have copied any motor they wanted. They chose the Scott Atwater. It is pretty much a direct copy; mechanically and cosmetically. Little or no attempt was made to conceal their plagiarism. They were produced in the USSR by the Moscow Machine-Building Plant "Krasny Oktyabr" aka "Red October" from 1955 to 1963 and another factory in Rzhev from 1963 to 1976. Other Scott models were copied as well. Numerous examples still exist today in that part of the world. It is referred to on forums as "the worst outboard ever" but enterprising enthusiasts continue to work to improve their ignition, carburetion and reliability.
