My name is Marc Hamer. Originally from Switzerland I have been a club member since 1995. I still go back and forth to visit family but not as often as I used to. I grew up on Lake Geneva (Not Wisconsin) just outside of Geneva (CH). My neighbor had an old Johnson AL-50 in his boat house and after asking him if I could buy it he said it's yours. That motor was used on a sail boat (L for long shaft) and only had a few hours on it. I was able to get spark and the motor ran great. Remember it's pretty neat to get an antique outboard there, specially for a 12 year old. I had a modern Johnson 8hp motor as well but I was more interested in old stuff. I worked on the motor with the help of a Gent at the local marina. The older gentleman there remembered the racing days and I asked him what's rare. He said a Soriono.... Didn't know what it was. I tried to get info on that motor since the 90s but no one knew a thing. His son had a lead on one sitting in a basement just outside of town, (in 2001) and that led me to finding a few more and bringing them here. I also came across a few nice Pentas and Archimedes. Although I have several Johnson's from the late 20s to early 30s I have a big interest in Shodas (Japan) as well as French and Swedish motors. It's nice to look at motors that are different. I recently moved from Atlanta GA to Henderson NV. I enjoy the drier climate and it's nice to be out on the lake on a sunny day. Hot yes sometimes but it beats the constant rain and humidity back east. I attended my first SoCal meet in Ontario this past spring, it was a blast. It's not a bad drive and I intend to come more often with some of my motors from Europe



## **An Experimental Sig Konrad 4-Stroke Outboard**

This is an Experimental **4-cycle outboard**. It is most likely one of a kind; having Serial Number 1 and 2 prominently stamped into 5 major parts. It was designed and built by *Sig Konrad* of Champion motors fame somewhere between 1926 and 1934. It has an oil reservoir and a dip stick on the front for checking oil level. There are 2 spark plugs in the removable cylinder head which makes one easily available if needed. The throttle is controlled by a sliding button on the end of the steering handle which operates a small bowden cable. There is a copper breather tube from the crankcase to the carb intake for relieving the crankcase of blowby pressure. The gearcase appears to have a bronze nosecone cast into it, not seen on Sig's other motors. The water pump uses a cast aluminum centrifugal impeller. The muffler is cast aluminum also. The valves are located just under the spark plugs, in the crankcase, similar to a flathead car engine. The water line and driveshaft tube are nickel plated. There is evidence of this motor being used, one of which is the plating is worn off of the driveshaft tube in the area of the thrust saddle.

There is an excellent article written in the July 1983 *Antique Outboarder* by Terry Kilcoyne who interviewed Sig at his home. This is one of the motors mentioned in that article. The article explains that Kilcoyne acquired the motor from Sig. It made it's way to a Wisconsin collector until it was finally acquired by it's present owner; AOMCI Member Harry Nicholson
